



VILARNAU BRUT NATURE STRIKES GOLD IN FRANCE

In the recent 35th edition of the *Challenge International du Vin* held in Bordeaux Gonzalez Byass wines achieved five medals with the highest accolade for Vilarnau Brut nature winning a Gold medal.

On the 8th and 9th of April the 35th edition of the Challenge International du Vin was held in Bordeaux. 4624 wines from 35 different countries were tasted by 768 professionals and consumers.

Of the 4624 wines presented from over 35 different countries only 28.22% received medals with 315 Gold, 467 Silver and 523 Bronze. Spanish wines were very successful obtaining 180 medals of which 5 were Gonzalez Byass wines

Vilarnau Brut Nature 2008 received the highest accolade with a Gold medal. In addition there were Bronze medals for Solera 1847, Finca Moncloa 2007, Gran Vos 2005 and Beronia Gran Reserva 2001.
